- Initial triage process (10 -20 minutes) requires 1 RN: 1 woman (includes fetal assessment)
- Ratio can change to 1: 2-3 as maternal-fetal status is determined to be stable

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Obstetric Triage. Obstetric triage volume typically exceeds the overall birth volume of a hospital by 20–50% 1. In a study of one large center, up to one third of evaluated women did not give birth at that time and were sent home or to another unit at the completion of their evaluation and management 2. Pregnant women most commonly present for evaluation for labor at term.

Management of EMTALA Regulations and Common Obstetric Risks

Obstetric patients presenting to the ED with complaints that are not clearly pregnancy-related should be triaged according to the institutions' resources, OB consultant availability, and diagnostic testing accessibility. 7 ACOG guidelines recommend coordination between the ED and the OB departments, including an agreement regarding the conditions that are best treated in the L&D unit, prioritization of the evaluation site based on patient needs, and the departments' abilities to provide ...

Recognizing that an obstetric ED would facilitate the institution's compliance with federal guidelines, obstetric standards and unit admission criteria, our nursing administrative team (in concert with physician leaders and the hospital attorney) worked to develop the triage unit concept into a viable entity.

The Obstetrical Triage Acuity Scale (OTAS) has been designed to establish a national standard that allows departments providing obstetrical assessment to evaluate acuity level and set guidelines for timely care. All patients presenting to the obstetrical triage area are triaged and prioritized according to the OTAS tool.

The charge nurse recorded, in 2-hr increments, number of roomed triage patients, number of patients waiting to be triaged, overall unit census, and available staff. AWHONN's recommended staffing guidelines were used to identify the indicated number of triage nurses needed on the basis of the number of triage patients.
